Thoughts From This Week's Sabbath School Lesson

Like Daniel, Noah is a prophet who predicts the end of the world. The Hebrew word for the "ark" (tevah) is the same rare Egyptian loanword that was used for the "ark," in which the infant Moses was hidden, who was preserved in order to save Israel from Egypt.

Also, some have seen in the general structure of the ark parallels to the ark of the tabernacle. Just as the ark of the Flood will permit the survival of humankind, so the ark of the covenant, a sign of God's presence in the midst of His people, points to God's work of salvation for His people.

"God gave Noah the exact dimensions of the ark and explicit directions in regard to its construction in every particular. Human wisdom could not have devised a structure of so great strength and durability. God was the designer, and Noah the master builder.

Again, the parallel between the two "arks" reaffirms their common redemptive function. Noah's obedience is thus described as a part of God's plan of salvation. Noah was saved simply because he had that faith to do what God commanded him to do. He was an early example of a faith that manifests itself in obedience, the only kind of faith that matters.
